"Pricing and Pass-through in Response to Subsidies and Competition: Evidence from Medicare Advantage Before and After the Affordable Care Act" (with Daria Pelech)

Abstract: After years of growth before the Affordable Care Act (ACA), federal payments to Medicare Advantage plans began to decline after the ACA. We exploit variation in these payments to assess how private plans respond to increases and decreases in these federal subsidies before and after the ACA, notably whether their response is symmetric. We find that private plans changed their pricing and pass-through to beneficiaries symmetrically, with plans passing through roughly 60 cents for each dollar of payment increases or decreases. However, during the period of payment reductions (post-ACA), plans reduced less salient benefits by more than they had increased them during the period of payment increases (pre-ACA), even though plans left premiums virtually unchanged. Partial pass-through suggests that plans operate above cost; plans in more competitive markets responded less to payment changes than plans in less competitive markets. Partial pass-through of payment cuts, combined with

quality bonuses and growth in risk scores, may explain the continued growth in Medicare Advantage enrollment post-ACA.

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
